Huntsville Heritage Walking Tour

In coordination with the Weber County Heritage Foundation and Huntsville's 100 Years of Community Anniversary, Huntsville will be conducting a 7 to 8 block loop walking tour to see several old buildings in Town which will include six businesses and seven old houses. The tour will be held on Saturday, August 17, and will start at 10 AM in front of the Huntsville Mercantile at 7390 E 200 S. Off-Highway Vehicles On Town Street

We have posted this article in the last two newsletters to inform our residents of the specific restrictions for OHVs and golf carts in our Town. We have been notified by the Weber County Sheriff they will now start citing any violations they see. It is important for owners of these vehicles to follow the regulations because if a young driver receives a citation it may prohibit that young person from receiving their driver's license until they are 18 years old. The regulations that have been posted are as follows:

1. OHVs and golf carts are prohibited on the streets and roads between the hours of 10 p.m. and 8 a.m. until October 31st. 2. OHVs and golf carts are prohibited on First Street (or 100 South). OHVs and golf carts are allowed to cross 100 south to gain private access.

3. OHVs and golf carts are prohibited from operating on shoulders of the roads or the verge (which is the area between the paved road and private property lines).

4. OHVs are not allowed in Huntsville Park.

5. A person under age 16 may not operate OHVs, including golf carts, and an owner may not give that person permission to operate an OHV or golf cart on Huntsville streets and roads.

6. All operators 16 years of age or older must possess either a valid driver's license or an OHV Education certificate.

Food Truck Event

Huntsville Town is looking to create a food truck court in the Town's empty lots across the street from the library. We are exploring the idea of having several food trucks, with some entertainment, hopefully on a weekend day. Many towns offer Food Truck Fridays or Food Truck Tuesdays to help bring their communities together. Huntsville is exploring the idea of creating a permanent commercial area in the empty lots, and starting out with food trucks will be a test to see if business can flourish. We need more places to eat and to gather as a community. Stay tuned for more details to come.
