## Culinary Water System Update

May saw a continuation of new water leaks this spring, both in Town and in our distribution line from the treatment plant to Town. We continued monitoring the area where we suspected of a major leak in the line outside of town and on the 29<sup>th</sup> we saw water surfacing and filling one of our test potholes. On the 30<sup>th</sup> we dug, found, and repaired a major leak! There are photos and further information on the town website under Residents-Culinary Water. As part of our yearly budgeting process, the Town Council will be reviewing culinary water system financial data regarding the increasing costs for sustainment and the potential of a raise in the water rates. Cost information will also be available on the website.

This is a hometown volunteer-run, low-key fun way for families to start their holiday but is not intended to be timed or provide a high-competition environment. Set your expectations accordingly, and you'll likely have a fabulous experience! We are starting our celebration on Thursday evening, July 3<sup>rd</sup>, with a presentation of our Patriotic Program in the new Town Community Center. Come kick off the celebration with an evening full of pride, honor and community spirit. On Friday, July 4th, we will have our usual schedule starting with our wakeup call, thanks to Weber County Sheriff Deputies, the Family Fun Run, the flag-raising, breakfast in the Park, Parade at 10 AM, games and activities, waterslides, Melodrama, the Patriotic Program (again) and end the day with an Epic Dance Party and the Fireworks Finale. The Town's Celebration also partners with the Hyde's,

owners of the Compass Rose, who offer the Mountain Arts and Music Festival, in Huntsville Square. This is the area behind the Joyful Smiles and old bar-b-q restaurant buildings. There will be 20 vendors of original fine art, a community art show and continuous music from 11 to 6.
