1 Mayor Richard Sorensen called the meeting to order. There is a full quorum present.

2-Pledge of Allegiance led by Former Mayor Jim Truett

3-Opening Ceremony given by Bruce Ahlstrom

4-Public Comments:

Sarge Tovar of the American Legion explained the details of the Memorial Day service at the Huntsville Cemetery including the announcement that there would be no flyover this year during the program. The jets were scheduled elsewhere. He informed the council that he is now the Vice Commander for Weber and Davis Counties.

Liz Poulter- came to thank the Town Council for all the good they do.

Jim Truett- is a Weber Fire Board member. The fire chief would like to come and make a presentation to the Town Council soon about some of the big changes coming to the valley.

6. Discussion and/or action on approval of Minutes for TC Meeting May 1, 2025 (See Attachment #1)

TCM Sandy Hunter made a small correction, and Nikki noted the change.

TCM Ahlstrom motioned to approve the Minutes for TC Meeting May 1, 2025.

TCM Sandy Hunter seconded the motion. All votes Ayes. Motion passed.

7. Discussion and/or action on Business License Item Mark Goodson Art (See Attachment #2)

TCM Sandy Hunter motioned to approve Business License Item Mark Goodson Art. TCM Ahlstrom seconded the motion. All votes ayes. Motion passed.

8. Discussion and/or action on approval of Ogden Boat Club Garbage Agreement (See Attachment #3)

TCM Sandy Hunter explained the history of the boat club agreement and the problem with garbage collection at their location near Cemetery Point.

TCM Ahlstrom motioned to approve the Ogden Boat Club Garbage Agreement. TCM Sandy Hunter seconded the motion. All votes Ayes. Motion passed.

9. Discussion and/or action on a New Cemetery at the Green Waste Facility.

TCM Ahlstrom used the map to discuss the plans they are working on to turn some of the green waste facility property into a cemetery.

He explained that the entrance would be in the northeast corner near a right-of-way owned by a neighbor to the south of the property. They had been in talks with him about using the road in exchange for road maintenance. They would need to survey the road and adjoining properties.

TCM Ahlstrom explained they would put up a berm to separate the cemetery from the green waste landfill. Huntsville's secondary water line was close by and he had spoken with a neighbor north of the property to access the water through their land for the new cemetery.

Lonny Bailey, who digs graves at the cemetery spoke about needing five feet of fill to cover the area. He had already secured 230 loads of dirt from contractors in just two days. The project would take thousands of loads but he was confident with all the construction in the area that they could get the dirt that they needed. He explained that they could also use loads of concrete and asphalt brought in to fill in the pit that's there. They could charge money for those loads.

The TC wondered how this plan was perceived by the neighbors. TCM Ahlstrom stated that there was a positive reaction.

Jim Truett, former mayor, wondered if the cemetery should be located on the south side of the property in the nice, secluded spot across the river that goes through the property. Lonny Bailey and TCM Ahlstrom spoke about how expensive it would be to replace the small bridge that provides access across the river. Another issue was the flood risk because it is close to the river.

TCM Ahlstrom went through the next steps they would need to take to get the cemetery idea rolling. They would need road base to begin improving the road, a rezone of the property from FV-3 to AV-3 to allow for a cemetery, and a survey.

The TC wondered if they were wasting money on the road materials if they were unable to get a rezone. TCM Ahlstrom explained that fixing the road would improve the property and still help the Town gain additional access to the property.

TCM Hunter motioned to proceed with plans to turn the green waste facility into a new cemetery. TCM Ahlstrom seconded the motion. Roll Call Vote. Votes are reflected below. Motion passed 5-0.

10. Discussion and/or action on approval of Landscaping Bid for Town Hall (See Attachment #4)

Rex Harris explained that what was needed now was to repair the existing sprinkler lines and plant new grass around Town Hall. Mayor Sorensen spoke with Town Treasurer Melissa Knowles and learned that there was \$24,000 left in the grant money for the new Town Hall for the landscaping plus they could use money from the general fund.

The TC discussed whether they should use the landscape plans that were already drawn. They wondered if fixing the sod and sprinkler lines would ruin any future landscaping plans. Rex Harris did not think they would. He said one of the bidders even included curbing in their price so they could set up areas now for future plants and trees.

TCM Sandy Hunter motioned to approve up to \$40,000 for landscaping for the New Town Hall with preference for the lowest bid. TCM Ahlstrom seconded the motion. Roll Call Vote. Votes reflected below. Motion passed 5-0.

11. Discussion and/or action on approval of \$9,500 for road repairs (See Attachment #5)

12. Discussion and/or action on approval of Weber Basin Water Shares

TCM Johnson had spoken with Bill White about subleasing Huntsville's Weber Basin water shares. If Bill White subleased the shares it would take \$7,000 off Huntsville's bill to Weber Basin. TCM Johnson had been told that Huntsville's shares are valuable and they shouldn't vacate them.

TCM Powell wondered why it had been said that Huntsville doesn't need the water. TCM Johnson explained that currently Huntsville Town has enough water. The contract to sublease the shares could be negotiated on a year-to-year basis so that if the Town needs the water in the future, they could still use it.

16. Discussion and/or action on approval of Special Event Canyon Pipeline (See Attachment #8)

Nikki, Town Clerk, explained that the company had called just a few days prior and wanted to hold a party for their employees at the park in the first week of June. She put them on the agenda even though she had already posted it because it would be too late if they waited for the next meeting.

She suggested they add a time frame on the special event application so there would be ample time to process it in the future. The TC spoke in favor of that idea.

Department Updates

Mayor Richard Sorensen- Blaine Vernon and Bruce Ahlstrom worked tirelessly at the Town Cleanup at the park and cemetery this year.

The mayor attended a meeting that week about the 4th of July celebration. This year the Town will be getting 10 percent of the breakfast revenue. Chandlyr Shupe, a town resident, is going all out on the Patriotic Program. She's planning a Town party coinciding with the program the night before the 4th.

Councilmember Sandy Hunter- She had nothing to add.

Councilmember Artie Powell- A couple living across the Rich Wilder fixed the Town Sign in the park during the town cleanup. The Songers are looking at repainting it. He and Blaine are still working on projects in the park.

Councilmember Bruce Ahlstrom- The north side of the cemetery is eroding into the lake and JUB is helping spearhead efforts to get it fixed. Others from the state are also helping. He met with Sean Harwood from the Forest Service who is retiring at the end of the month. TCM Ahlstrom found out that four entities own land and water rights around that area. Ben Palmer from Representative Moore's office will help coordinate with the different entities to get it done. He was going to meet with him at 10:00 a.m. the following morning.

Councilmember Lewis Johnson – He had nothing to add.

TCM Powell motioned to approve the April 2025 Bills. TCM Johnson seconded the motion. All votes ayes. Motion passed.

1 Mayor Richard Sorensen called the meeting to order. There is a full quorum present.

2-Pledge of Allegiance led by Lt. Butler

3-Opening Ceremony given by Artie Powell

4-Public Comments:

Sarge Tovar reported on recent activities at the American Legion. He spoke about Memorial Day services and honoring Ambrose Hadley, a WW II vet. This year's program will be at noon at Cemetery Point. The Town Council asked Lt. Butler for a police escort to get into the cemetery. Sarge Tovar concluded with a review of upcoming activities including June Jam and Father's Day.

5. Sheriff's Report

Lt. Butler stated that in the first quarter there were 97 reports in Huntsville. He explained that the officers in Weber County are currently working hundreds of overtime hours.

The Ogden Marathon will be on May 17th and the UHP will be helping direct traffic at the Huntsville intersections. He announced that the Wounded Warrior and RAGNAR races have both been canceled this year.

In addition, he explained that the County is raising their parking fines around Pineview Reservoir from \$50 to \$150. The Town Council spoke about Huntsville also raising their fines to match Weber County's. The TC felt that people will park in the Town's "no-parking zones" to avoid higher fines from the county, especially if Huntsville's remain at \$50.

The Sheriff's department is considering doing a checkpoint this year down at Cemetery Point. TCM Sandy Hunter asked if Huntsville could get a sheriff to patrol the area on weekends because kids are starting to ride their ATVs illegally in town.

6. Discussion and/or action on approval of Minutes for TC Meeting March 20, 2025 (See Attachment #1)

TCM Sandy Hunter motioned to approve the Minutes for TC Meeting March 20, 2025. TCM Powell seconded the motion. All votes Ayes. Motion passed.

7. Discussion and/or action on approval of Minutes for Work Session March 26, 2025 (See Attachment #2)

TCM Sandy Hunter motioned to approve the Minutes for Work Session March 26, 2025. Mayor Sorensen seconded the motion. All votes Ayes. Motion passed.

8. Discussion and/or action on approval of Minutes for TC Meeting April 8, 2025 (Attachment #3)

TCM Sandy Hunter motioned to approve the Minutes for TC Meeting April 8, 2025. TCM Johnson seconded the motion. All votes Ayes. Motion passed.

9. Discussion and/or action on approval of Food Sales at Huntsville Park during Rec baseball Games (See Attachment #4)

Beckki, Town Clerk, explained that Ogden Valley Rec wants to sell food at the park this summer during baseball games. She said that they would need a peddler's license. Mayor Sorensen and others said that OV Rec. has been a responsible group. They have improved the park and there haven't been any problems during the games.

TCM Abstrom motioned to approve the OV Rec selling prepackaged food at the park with a peddler's license and if they want to prepare food onsite, they will need to get a food handlers permit from the county. TCM Powell seconded the motion. All votes ayes. Motion passed.

Later in the meeting Corey Cozzens, a representative of OV Rec., came and explained that they would be getting food trucks to come to the park during a couple of games this summer. He asked the Town to help advertise it so they could get a good turnout. The TC thought the northwest corner of the park would be a good spot. TCM Hunter said they could put it in the newsletter.

10. Discussion and/or action on approval of repairs for Jeff Hansen Driveway (See Attachment #5)

Esther Hansen attended the meeting and her husband Jeff was on Face Time. TCM Bruce Ahlstrom explained that a section of the Hansen's driveway was damaged last year when a leak in the town's water system caused the concrete to break apart. The heavy machinery used to repair the leak also appeared to cause damage to the driveway. Jeff Hansen had approached the

Town Council last fall to get help paying to repair the driveway. At the time the TC voted 2-2 so it was not approved.

Jeff Hansen asked the Town Council once again to pay for both slabs to be replaced. The whole driveway would cost \$17,000, but he was asking the town to pay for the portion that was damaged in the leak and leak repair. That amount came to \$5,728. One other bid was 20% higher than that.

TCM Sandy Hunter motioned to pay for half of the total cost of the damaged area, which is \$2,874. TCM Ahlstrom seconded the motion.

TCM Lewis Johnson stated that historically the Town has tried to repair damages to landscapes and driveways on town property after utility repairs, but it is not required. He wanted to say on record that they are not wishing to set a precedence. TCM Sandy Hunter referenced the ordinance that states that when the Town accesses the verge for utility work the homeowner is responsible for fixing driveways and any landscaping. She understands that the leak has caused the problem and that's hard, but the Town needs to enforce the ordinance. Mayor Sorensen agreed with TCM Johnson and also understands how a person wants to have landscaping and concrete in the Town verge. At his new home under construction, he is planning on having his driveway built all the way to the road and is accepting that he may have to pay for damages to his driveway in the future.

TCM Powell wondered if the driveway may not have been constructed up to code in the first place.

11. Discussion and/or action on approval of Resolution 2025-02-20 Huntsville Town Hall Rules (See Attachment #6)

The TC discussed whether they should change the third rule and allow alcohol. TCM Sandy Hunter wondered if they could charge an extra fee for alcohol. It was pointed out that you don't need an alcohol license if it's a private party. With his experience in his private business Mayor Sorensen said that alcohol can be problematic and that there are other options in town for drinking alcohol. The TC talked about allowing alcohol with exceptions, but TCM Powell stated that if they're going to allow them they need to written in the rules.

Other additions and changes to the rules included adding that weddings are not allowed in the Community center. TCM Hunter stated that since weddings are already not allowed in the park it needs to be written on the website.

The TC changed rule #2 to read, "No candles or open flames in the building except as approved by the town staff." to allow for food warmers that have flames underneath.

TCM Powell suggested changing rule #5 to read "No animals in the building except as provided by law."

TCM Sandy Hunter motioned to approve Resolution 2025-2-20-B with the additions and changes stated. TCM Ahlstrom seconded the motion. Votes reflected below. Motion passed 4-0.

12. Discussion and/or action on Resolution 2025-5-1-B GMI Contract for Mapping Services (See Attachment #7)

Water Board chair Ron Gault explained that they wanted to hire GMI to map their secondary and culinary water lines. It would cost \$275 per hour and take around 10 hours. They hired a college student to do some of the work to cut down on costs. The TC pointed out that "culinary water lines" needed to be added to the resolution.

13. Discussion and/or action on Culinary Water Updates (See Attachment #8)

Ron Gault explained current issues in the culinary water system including high water pressure, distribution being higher than usage, the cost of fixing leaks, and various ways to fix a problem area on 1800 S. He stressed preventative maintenance. He explained a need for residents to flag

the meters on their properties ahead of the GIS Mapping project. He and Blaine suggested getting a local Boy Scout group to distribute the flags.

14. Discussion and/or action on approval of up to \$8,000 for Zion's Bank Water Rates Study (See Attachment #9)

Beckki explained that the water rate study would take 3-4 weeks. It will help the Town determine the right rate for water usage. If people complain about higher rates the Town can reference the study.

The Town has been unable to get help with the great water leak because the income level among its citizens is too high, and the fees are too low.

Beckki spoke about Huntsville's water connection fees. She explained that the fees need to be tied to actual costs such as installation, supplies, maintenance, and clerical work. She explained that if you don't have an impact fee study you can't charge an impact fee. In order to have an impact fee you need growth and that is something Huntsville does not have.

Beckki learned about a new study they are doing called TUFS. It is a new study for utilities because the cost for water and roads is going up so much. One of these studies is currently being done in Weber County in the Ogden Valley area. After doing it, an additional fee can be put in the water bill to pay for roads. Huntsville could do this study in the future.

TCM Ahlstrom wondered if they had to pay for a study every time they wanted to raise the water rates. TCM Hunter wondered if the water rate study would find that Huntsville needed to raise their rates. Ron Gault felt that it would. He said that if the auditor were to look at all the expenses for maintenance on the water system in the past year they would say our rates are way too low.

TCM Sandy Hunter motioned to approve the water study for \$8,000. TCM Ahlstrom seconded the motion. Roll Call vote. Votes reflected below. Motion passed 5-0.

18. Discussion and/or action on approval of the appointment of Brent Bateman as the Appeals Authority and the termination of the Board of Adjustments (See Attachment #13)

After looking over the information given TCM Sandy Hunter was impressed with Brent Bateman. She felt that it was a good step to get a third party to do this job. His services would be paid for by those who seek an appeal. Beckki explained that Mr. Bateman works for many cities and was recommended by Huntsville's attorney.

Beckki reminded the Town Council that the last few appeals cases were very complex and the Town ended up paying way more for legal advice than what they had charged in fees. It is now in our fee schedule for the appellant to pay a base rate plus legal fees.

TCM Sandy Hunter motioned to approve Brent Bateman as the Appeals Authority, and terminate the current board of adjustments. TCM Ahlstrom seconded the motion.

TCM Powell was concerned with the open-ended costs. Beckki stated that Mr. Bateman would look at the case and give a fee. The Town could handle it another way if it's too expensive for the townspeople. Roll call vote. Votes reflected below. Motion passed 5-0.

This letter proposes extending the agreement between the Ogden Boat Club and the Town of Huntsville regarding garbage service.

The Town Council formally approved this arrangement on June 2, 2022, for an initial term of two years. The Town now proposes to extend the agreement for an additional ten years, through to June 1, 2035, unless circumstances arise that necessitate reconsideration or termination of the arrangement.

15-Discussion and/or action on Ordinance 2022-5-26-A: An Ordinance Amending the A-3 zone. (See Attachment #8) Shannon Smith gave the background for this ordinance. Beckki has added the residential standards to this ordinance. There have been modifications based on animals and equipment that might be stored in the A-3 zone. For example, in the previous ordinance the references to beavers were taken out of the code.

TCM Anderson asked about the conditional uses under this title. He commented the phrase "permitted, conditional uses" is confusing. He suggested the references to slaughtering of animals in an area where people are paying a premium for the land they are purchasing, is not a desirable use of a three-acre lot. The Town Council discussed the purpose of the A-3 zone. TCM Hunter suggested the HOA for the Sage Development would govern many of the things suggested in the zone chapter. TCM Anderson suggested the Town Council think about the difference between hobby farming and actual slaughtering of small animals on a three-acre lot. TCM Sandy Hunter stated the Planning Commission had a hard time recommending the slaughtering of animals. She suggested the TC delete that from the ordinance.

Huntsville Town rates were established in April 2018. Our agreement with the Weber County Sheriff's Office was also established at that time. Our current parking fine is \$50.00.

ORDINANCE NO: 2025-5-15

AN ORDINANCE OF HUNTSVILLE TOWN RAISING PARKING FEES IN REPONSE TO THE INCREASE IN FINES LEVIED BY WEBER COUNTY AROUND PINEVIEW RESERVOIR

WHEREAS, Huntsville Town (hereafter "Town") is a municipal corporation, duly organized and existing under the laws of the state of Utah;

WHEREAS, Weber County amended their parking fines in Weber County Code section 42-4-8 and increased fines around Pineview Reservoir starting on May 15th, 2025;

WHEREAS, many of the areas of access to the Pineview Reservoir are located on the streets of the Huntsville Town peninsula.

WHEREAS, the Huntsville Town Council does not desire to see an increase in the parking traffic pushed to Huntsville Town by the increase in fines from Weber County parking areas;

WHEREAS, Huntsville Town Code 12.5 prohibits parking along the streets designated "No Parking" or "Parking by Permit Only" by a sign or device placed in said area in Huntsville Town from May 1 through September 30th;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Town Council of Huntsville, Utah as follows:

Repealer. This resolution supersedes any and all previously adopted parking fine schedules and shall not make invalid any other fees associated with traffic fines and citations.

Section 2: Amendment. The Huntsville Town parking fines are amended as follows:

From May 1st through September 30th each year, the fines in this subsection shall apply on any vehicle parked along the streets designated "No Parking" or "Parking By Permit Only" by as sign or device placed in said area, or, everything West of 7300 East as being a no roadside parking area.

- 1. For a vehicle owner who has had no violations of this chapter during the one-year period before the date of the citation:
 - a. If the fine is paid within 14 days from the date of the notice of violation, or if the citation is contested with a hearing officer within 14 days but is sustained, the fine shall be \$150.00.
 - b. If the fine is not paid or contested within 14 days, the fine shall be increased to \$300.00.
- 2. For a vehicle owner who has had one or more previous violations of this chapter during the one-year period before the date of the citation:

- a. If the fine is paid within 14 days from the date of the notice of violation, or if the citation is contested with a hearing officer within 14 days, but is sustained, the fine shall be \$300.00.
- b. If the fine is not paid or contested within 14 days, the fine shall be increased to \$600.00.

Section 3: Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon adoption.

Summary: Weber County has seen an increase in parking violations near Pineview Reservoir and Causey Reservoirs, particularly during summer months (May 15th through September 15th). These parking violations create a public safety hazard by increasing pedestrian traffic near moving vehicles and by reducing the travel space available for vehicular traffic, including emergency vehicles. In an effort to improve this situation and deter parking violations in these areas, increased fines for parking violations are being proposed. Currently, parking violations in these areas result in a fine of \$50 if paid within 14 days, and \$100 if paid after 14 days. The new fines shall apply as follows:

- May 15th through September 15th each year on any highway or road where Weber County has parking enforcement authority in the following two locations: (i) the road to Causey Reservoir, and all roads branching off of it, east of the entrance to the Weber Memorial Park campground; and (ii) all locations within one quarter mile of the Pineview Reservoir high water mark.
 - For a vehicle owner who has had no violations during the one-year period before the date of the citation:
 - If the fine is paid within 14 days from the date of the notice of violation, or if the citation is contested with a hearing officer within 14 days but is sustained, the fine shall be \$150.00.
 - 2. If the fine is not paid or contested within 14 days, the fine shall be increased to \$300.00.
 - For a vehicle owner who has had one or more previous violations during the one-year period before the date of the citation:
 - If the fine is paid within 14 days from the date of the notice of violation, or if the citation is contested with a hearing officer within 14 days but is sustained, the fine shall be \$300.00.
 - 2. If the fine is not paid or contested within 14 days, the fine shall be increased to \$600.00.
- All other locations and times.
 - The fines shall be as follows:
 - If the fine is paid within 14 days from the date of the notice of violation, or if the citation is contested with a hearing officer within 14 days but is sustained, the fine shall be \$50.00.
 - 2. If the fine is not paid or contested within 14 days, the fine shall be increased to \$100.00.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners finds that existing parking fines are insufficient to deter parking violations in these areas;

NOW THEREFORE, the Board of County Commissioners of Weber County ordains as follows:

1. Section 42-4-8 of the Code of Ordinances of Weber County, Utah, is amended as follows:

Section 42-4-8 Fine

Any person who violates the provisions of this chapter shall be liable for a civil fine. If the fine is paid within 14 days from the date of the notice of violation, or if the citation is contested with a hearing officer within 14 days, the fine shall be \$50.00. If the fine is not paid or contested within 14 days, the fine shall be increased to \$100.00

Any person who violates the provisions of this chapter shall be liable for a civil fine in the amounts listed in this section.

- (a) From May 15th through September 15th each year, the fines in this subsection shall apply on any highway or road where Weber County has parking enforcement authority in the following two locations: (i) the road to Causey Reservoir, and all roads branching off of it, east of the entrance to the Weber Memorial Park campground; and (ii) all locations within one quarter mile of the Pineview Reservoir high water mark.
 - (1) For a vehicle owner who has had no violations of this chapter during the one-year period before the date of the citation:

- a. If the fine is paid within 14 days from the date of the notice of violation, or if the citation is contested with a hearing officer within 14 days but is sustained, the fine shall be \$150.00.
- b. If the fine is not paid or contested within 14 days, the fine shall be increased to \$300.00.
- (2) For a vehicle owner who has had one or more previous violations of this chapter during the one-year period before the date of the citation:
 - a. If the fine is paid within 14 days from the date of the notice of violation, or if the citation is contested with a hearing officer within 14 days but is sustained, the fine shall be \$300.00.
 - b. If the fine is not paid or contested within 14 days, the fine shall be increased to \$600.00.
- (b) For all other locations and times, the fines shall be as follows:
 - (1) If the fine is paid within 14 days from the date of the notice of violation, or if the citation is contested with a hearing officer within 14 days but is sustained, the fine shall be \$50.00.
 - (2) If the fine is not paid or contested within 14 days, the fine shall be increased to \$100.00.

2. Effective date and publication

- a. This ordinance shall take effect 15 days after its passage.
- b. The Clerk/Auditor's office is directed to publish a short summary of this ordinance in the *Standard Examiner* newspaper before 15 days after the date of its passage.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN WEBER COUNTY AND HUNTSVILLE RELATING TO THE PARKING ENFORCEMENT

This Memorandum of Understanding (hereafter "Agreement") is made and entered into by and between the Weber County Sheriff's Office, a body politic, corporate and political subdivision of Weber County, State of Utah, (hereafter "WCSO") with its main office located at 721 W 12th St, Ogden, Utah, 84404, and Huntsville Town, a municipal corporation of the state of Utah, hereafter "Town", with its main office at 7309 East 200 South, Huntsville, Utah 84317.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, WCSO is the law enforcement provider for Town and certain portions of Weber County (hereafter "County");

WHEREAS, WCSO and Town are encountering continual parking enforcement issues in and around Town;

WHEREAS, WCSO and Town desires to enter this Agreement relating to parking enforcement;

NOW, THEREFORE, WCSO and Town enter into this Memorandum of Understanding with the following terms and conditions:

SECTION ONE SERVICES PROVIDED

- 1. Ordinance. Town has adopted Chapter 42.4 of the Weber County Code, entitled "Parking" (hereafter "Code), and WCSO and Town shall enforce the same. Town as also adopted Title 12 of the Huntsville Municipal Code, entitled "Parking and Overnight Camping" (hereafter also "Code").
- Parking Violation. Any parking violation under the Code:
 - a. If written by Town, then Town shall submit a copy of the written citation submitted to WCSO for processing through the Sheriff's Office Records Management System by WCSO staff, with the correct location/area code designated.
 - b. If written by County (such as a County Park staff), a written copy of the citation shall be submitted to the WCSO for processing through the Sheriff's Office Records Management System by WCSO staff, with the correct location/area code designated.
 - c. If written by WCSO, a written copy of the citation shall be processed through the Sheriff's Office Records Management System by WCSO staff, with the correct location/area code designated.

- 3. Fines. All fines shall be collected by the WCSO as follows:
 - a. Fines can be paid in person at the WCSO.
 - b. Fines can be paid online through the WCSO web page.
 - c. Any fines collected on behalf of Town by the County or WCSO shall be paid to Town on a monthly basis, with a report of the citations issued and fines collected.
 - d. WCSO may retain an "administrative fee", for administrative costs associated with collection, not to exceed ten percent (10%) of each fine collected by the County or WCSO.
 - e. WCSO may submit unpaid fines to a third-party collection agency, as provided by law or policy of the County, if necessary. All parties to this Agreement understand that an additional percentage of the fines collected may be retained by the third-party collection agency.
- 4. Administrative Proceedings. Town hereby designates the WCSO Administrative Hearing Officer to handle any disputed citations relating to the Town as may be issued by County, WCSO, or Town. WCSO may retain an additional ten percent (10%), representing a "hearing fee", of each fine collected that is subject of an administrative hearing (for total "administrative fee" and hearing fee") not to exceed twenty percent (20%) of the total fine collected.
- 5. Labels. WCSO shall provide Town with labels or adhere to any parking citations submitted to the WCSO indicating the appropriate information for the citation.

SECTION TWO MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

- 1. Governing Law. The provision of this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Utah.
- Records Administration. County and City shall each maintain appropriate records necessary to properly administer the terms of this Agreement.
- 3. Indemnification. County agrees to indemnify, save harmless and release City and all its officers, agents, volunteers, and employees from and against any and all loss, damages, injury, liability, suits and proceedings arising out of performance of this Agreement which are caused in whole or in part by the negligence of the County.
- 4. Employee Status. Employees of WCSO, County, and Town shall only be construed as employees from the jurisdiction for which they are employed. Each party to this Agreement agrees to abide by the provisions of Title 6 and 7 of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and any other federal or state law.
- 5. Headings. The headings used in this instrument are for convenience purposes only and afford no legal right.

- 6. Severability. The declaration by any court of competent jurisdiction or any other binding legal source, that any provision of this Agreement is illegal or void, shall not effect the legality and enforceability of any other provision of this Agreement, unless the provisions are mutually dependent.
- 7. Entire Agreement. This Agreement shall constitute the entire Agreement between WCSO and Town, unless an a separate writing is made and signed. Any prior comments, understanding, or representation of any kind that are not set forth in this Agreement shall not be binding upon any party except to the extent incorporated in this Agreement.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, WCSO and Town have executed this Agreement to be effective upon proper execution by both parties.



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
